#### **National Data Collection**

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability is a compulsory annual collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment to their schooling due to disability and the level of reasonable adjustment they are receiving. Personal details, such as student names or other identifying information, are not provided to local or federal education authorities.

For the purposes of the national data collection, students with learning difficulties (such as dyslexia or auditory processing disorder), chronic health conditions (such as epilepsy or diabetes) that require monitoring and the provision of adjustments by the school, or other physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional disabilities, may be included. Pre-Primary students will automatically progress to Year 1. Kindy students will automatically progress to pre-primary. If you do not plan to return in 2018 please notify the school.


