

Dress Code



Woodbridge Primary School aspires to be the most caring and encouraging community school

Updated April 2021

Woodbridge Primary School, in consultation with the School Board, has established a dress code for all students attending the school.

PURPOSE OF THE DRESS CODE

The Woodbridge Primary School Dress Code:

- Ensures compliance with Department of Education requirements.
- Gives the students a sense of unity, belonging and pride in their school, which assists in building school and team spirit.
- Ensures that students are safely dressed for school activities.
- Clearly identifies Woodbridge Primary School students.
- Fosters and enhances the public image of the school.
- Encourages equity by minimising competition between students to wear more expensive or fashionable clothing and reduces the pressure on parents to purchase this type of clothing.

MODIFICATION TO THE DRESS CODE

Parents of students who for religious, cultural, personal or health reasons may need to modify the school dress code are required to discuss this with the Principal. Staff members will be informed of any student granted a modification to the dress code. Requests for short term amendments should be discussed with class teachers.

SANCTIONS FOR NON-COMPLIANCE

Students not following the dress code will, in the first instance, receive counselling by the Teacher, Principal or Principal's nominee on the benefits of complying with the dress code. If this action fails to elicit compliance, then:

- The Parents/Guardian will be contacted, whereby parents will be asked to ensure that the student complies with the Dress Code.
- Assistance/support will be provided for parents/caregivers to obtain suitable clothing if necessary; and as a last resort,
- Exclusion from participation in extra curricular or non essential activities may be applied.

AVAILABILITY OF DRESS CODE ITEMS:

To assist parents/caregivers to meet the Dress Code Woodbridge Primary School will endeavour to ensure that second-hand clothes are available at the Uniform Shop or an alternative supplier.

Parents/guardians having financial difficulties regarding the purchase of a uniform should contact the Principal to discuss the situation.

Parents purchasing school uniforms from alternative suppliers may do so. The current school colours and uniform style must be adhered to.

WOODBIDGE PRIMARY SCHOOL DRESS REQUIREMENTS:

Please note: the only logo permissible on clothing items is the school logo. No denim is allowed to be worn by either students or staff on designated school days.

Summer Dress Code

- Royal Blue Polo shirt;
- Navy blue shorts;
- Woodbridge school dress, or plain navy blue skirt/skorts; and Graduation/Leavers shirt (Year 6 graduating students).

Winter Dress Code

As per Summer, with the following items permitted:

- Plain navy blue track suit pants/cargos/jazz pants;
- Royal blue zip cardigans;
- Long sleeve Royal Blue polo shirt;
- Navy Wet weather zip jacket;
- Plain navy or black leggings under skirts, skorts or dresses only; and
- Navy long sleeved t-shirts may be worn under school polo shirts.

SPECIAL EVENTS CLOTHING

In some circumstances, students will be permitted to wear alternative uniforms as agreed to by class teachers and administration.

ATHLETICS

Faction shirts, with the school logo, can be purchased from the uniform shop and worn on scheduled PE lesson days in the weeks leading up to the Athletics Carnival (Athletics term only). These are not to be worn on school excursions.

FOOTWEAR AND HEADWEAR

Shoes or sandals with straps must be worn at all times. Particular activities such as sport, cooking or excursions may necessitate enclosed footwear.

A navy wide brimmed reversible bucket hat is compulsory for all outdoor activities. This includes recess and lunch breaks. It is preferable that students wear the style of hats sold in the Uniform Shop.

JEWELLERY

In the interest of safety, earrings (if worn) should be of the small sleeper or stud variety. It is preferred that chains, necklaces and bracelets (hand and ankle) not be worn as they are easily broken. Medic-alert bracelets/jewellery are, of course, acceptable.

MAKE UP AND/OR COLOURED NAIL POLISH

Make-up and nail polish is not appropriate. Students may be required to remove this if it is worn to school.

HAIRSTYLES

Hair should be neatly groomed and kept out of the eyes. Shoulder length or longer hair must be kept tied back from the face. Students may be asked to tie their hair up if they attend school and have not complied.

All clothing, especially hats, must be marked clearly with the student's name.
